As a partner student, you are part of the SHU student community and have access to a wide range of academic support, resources and opportunities alongside your studies.

This resource will help you understand what it means to be a partner student and how to make the most of everything you have access to at Hallam.

What does it mean to be a partner student?



You are studying a course delivered by your partner institution that is validated or accredited by Sheffield Hallam University.

This means:

- Your course meets SHU academic standards
- Upon completion of your studies, you will receive an award from Sheffield Hallam University
- You can access SHU systems, resources and support

Your day-to-day teaching will take place at your partner institution, but Sheffield Hallam University works closely with your tutors and course team. If you have academic concerns, you should speak to the course team at your partner institution first.

A dedicated Partner Student Lead Rep supports this work, and their contact details are available on our website.



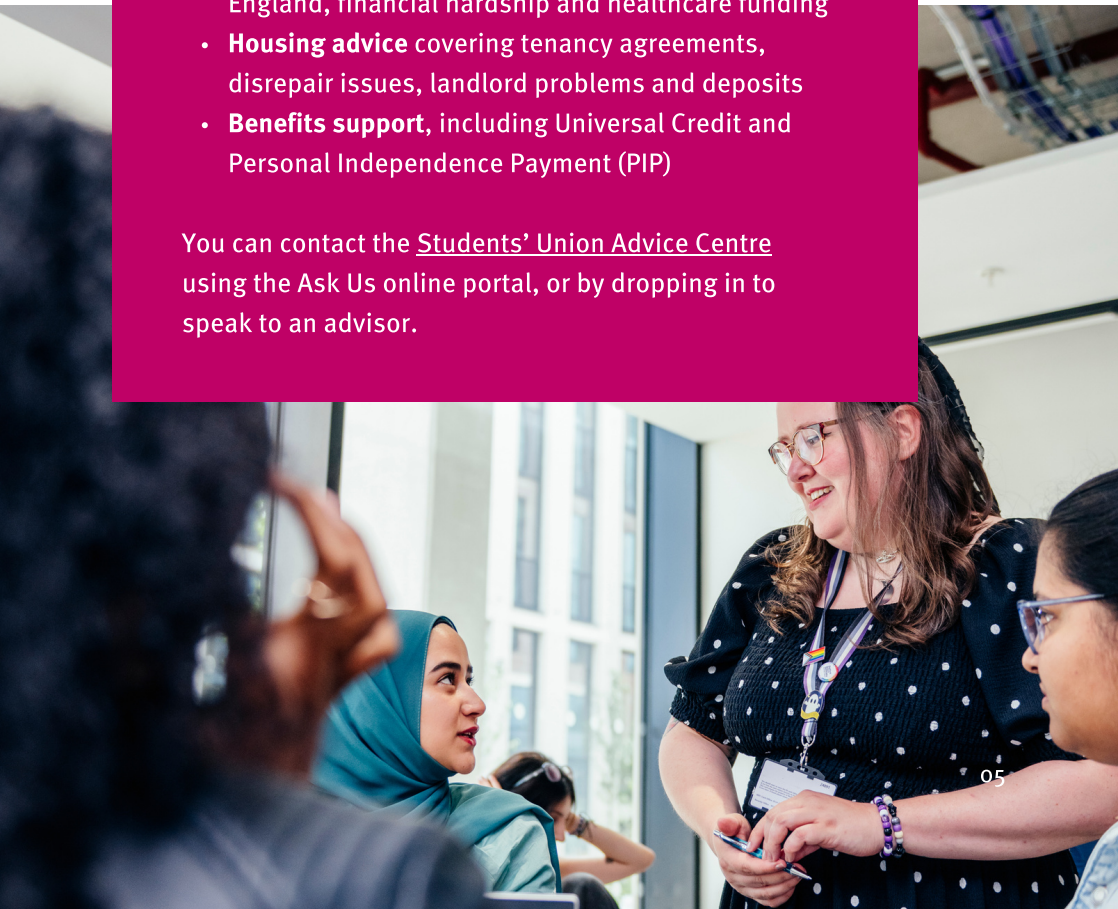


Need Advice?

As a partner student, the Hallam Students' Union Advice Centre is here to support you. You can access free, confidential advice on a wide range of issues, including:

- **Academic matters** such as academic misconduct, complaints, appeals, fitness to practise, disciplinary issues and withdrawals
- **Finance queries**, including Student Finance England, financial hardship and healthcare funding
- **Housing advice** covering tenancy agreements, disrepair issues, landlord problems and deposits
- **Benefits support**, including Universal Credit and Personal Independence Payment (PIP)

As a partner student, you will receive SHU login details once you have completed the enrolment process.

Enrolment

All students are required to complete the enrolment process before starting their course. You will receive an email invitation to enrol, usually one to two weeks before your course begins. This will be sent to the email address you used when applying through your partner institution.

Enrolment will guide you through activating your Sheffield Hallam IT account, checking and updating your personal details, and applying for your SHUcard. You will receive your SHUcard via your college during the first term of your course.



Library & Learning Resources



Once you have received your SHUcard it is essential that you activate your login details, you will then be able to:

- Enter the library
- Borrow up to 5 books at a time & place a request on 1 book at a time
- Access a range of resources:
 - **Library Online** - search for print resources available in the Library before visiting
 - **ProQuest Central** - access a wide range of academic journal articles
 - **APA Referencing Guide & RefWorks** - support with accurate referencing
 - Online academic study skills guides
