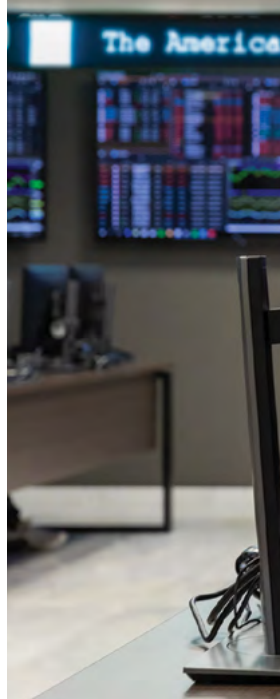

Tuition: Up to 15 credit hours of classes for either the fall or the spring semester, or 6 credit hours for summer sessions.

Housing: Modern, fully furnished and equipped apartments, within short walking distance of the College. The comprehensive fee includes double bedroom occupancy. You may choose to upgrade to a single room or studio at an extra charge and given availability.

Visa Assistance: The International Student Services Office has a visa officer who will work with you to secure the required documents and will obtain visa pre-approval to take to a local Greek consulate for visa pick-up.

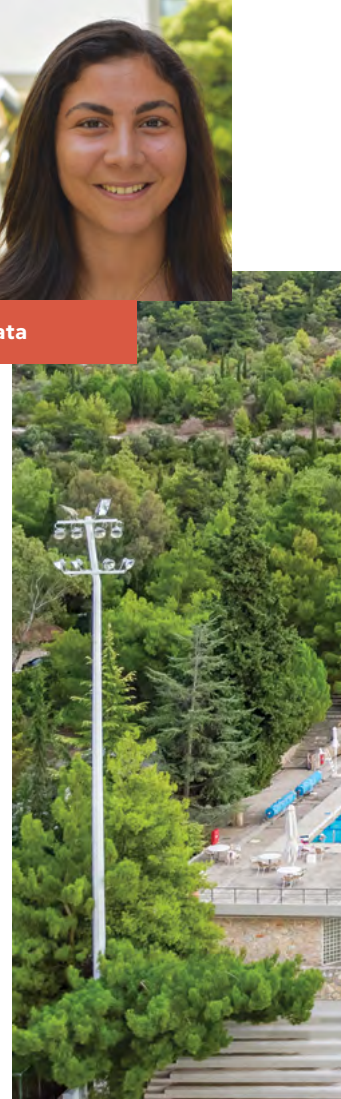
