BELGIUM IN A NUTSHELL

LANGUAGES

French, Dutch and German are Belgium's three official languages. An invisible linguistic border divides the country roughly into two parts: the French-speaking South and the Dutch-speaking North. There is also a German-speaking community along the German border. Brussels is an important bilingual entity (French-Dutch), having a majority of French speakers. Apart from a few exceptions, the other regions are monolingual.

COST OF LIVING

To meet everyday living expenses a single student should have between 600€ and 800€ per month at his/her disposal except for the first month when expenses might be higher. To this amount he/she should add study-related costs (books, etc.).

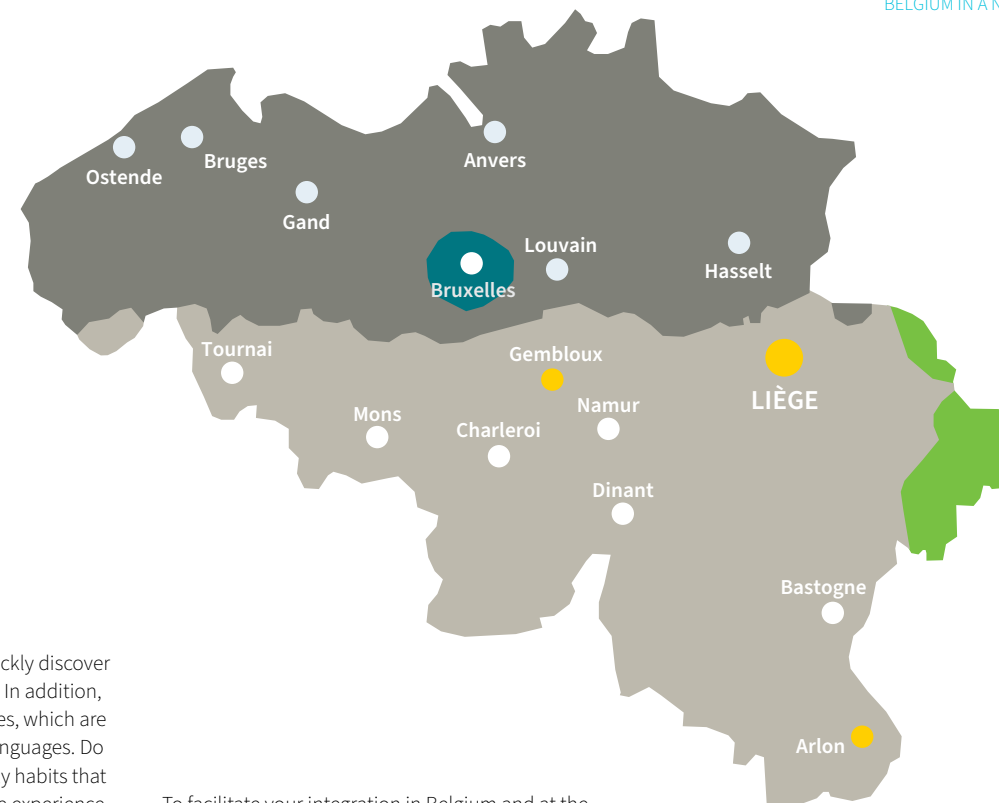
Belgium covers 30,688 km² and has about 11.5 million inhabitants.

BILINGUAL OR "FULL ENGLISH" STUDY PROGRAMMES

Language learning, just like student mobility, is a priority at the University of Liège. While all courses (teaching units) involve language courses or are given in foreign languages, some courses are bilingual (French/English, French/German...) or are taught entirely in English. A Master's degree in Multilingual Communication, taught in English, is now proposed and mainly attracts international students who do not speak French yet.

THE TRADITIONAL UNIVERSITY CAREER

In Belgium, university studies are in line with the European model. They are organised into three cycles: bachelor's, master's and doctorate. The average academic studies are carried out in 2 cycles, generally in 5 years (bachelor+master).

EXAMINATIONS

Within the same academic year students can take two examinations on the same teaching unit (course).

Exams are organised by the Faculties during the three periods decided by the Board of Directors (see the academic calendar). The 1st and 2nd periods are called 1st session (January and June). The 3rd period is called the 2nd session (August-September).

By way of derogation, Faculties can decide on special examination modalities for exchange students. In this case the exchange student must get in touch with the involved professors and the departmental coordinator at the beginning of term.

The result of each assessment is indicated by a figure between 0 and 20, with 10 out of 20 being the pass threshold for each teaching unit.

When you take an examination, remember to tell your teacher that you are an exchange student.

Marks received at ULiège are transferred to your home university by your ULiège departmental coordinator. The grade distribution table is sent with your transcript of records. You will find the general table for ULiège on our webpage

4 ACADEMIC CALENDAR

1 THE ECTS SYSTEM

ECTS credits (European Credit Transfer and Accumulation System) has been created to facilitate the transfer of credits earned abroad.

ECTS credits correspond to a set amount of learning based on both defined learning outcomes and the related workload.

60 ECTS credits correspond to the learning outcomes and workload of a full time academic year. One term corresponds to 30 credits.

PREPARING YOUR DEPARTURE

- 1 Discuss the courses you intend to take at ULiège with your coordinator in your home university.
- 2 Students applying for the first term or for the whole academic year have to complete the online application **before 31 May**.

Students applying for the second term have to complete the online application form **before 15 November**.

Be careful: it will not be possible to complete the online Application Form after the deadlines.

At the end of the Application Form, you have to upload the required documents.

- 3 If you need a visa to enter in Belgium, take the necessary steps with the Belgian embassy in your home country (with the ULiège acceptance letter) **before** arriving in Belgium.

Any change that may occur during your stay in Liège (change of address, telephone number, etc.) must be entered via the myULiège portal (Gestion > Mes inscriptions > Mon dossier > Moyens de contact > modifier).

1 ALL STUDENTS

Any foreigner staying in Belgium for more than three months in a row must notify the administration of the city in which she/he stays.

2 EU STUDENTS

For students from EEE countries (EU + Iceland, Liechtenstein and Norway), required documents:

- Health insurance European card or some other evidence that you have subscribed a health insurance
- a valid passport or identity card
- the certificate of registration from the Erasmus Office at the University of Liège
- 2 recent photographs (passport format)
- 8€ + 20€ for the residence card (see rates applicable on registration date)
- an address in Liège (if in a students' residence, a residence statement)

EU students can move from one EU country to another with a national ID or passport; no visa is required.

3 STUDENTS FROM A COUNTRY OUTSIDE THE EU

Non-EU students **must** report their arrival at the city hall on arrival (after registration at ULiège) to get a residence permit.

For students from a country outside the EU, required documents:

- your passport with a D visa
- the certificate of registration from the Erasmus Office at the University of Liège
- 2 recent photographs (passport format)
- 8€ + 20€ for the residence card (see rates applicable on registration date)
- an address in Liège (if in a students' residence, a residence statement)

Students from outside the EU who stay in Belgium and wish to travel around should have a passport and an A card (residence permit) supplied at the city hall.

To travel **outside the Schengen area**, ask the diplomatic mission of the country you wish to go whether a visa is required.

Non-european students may have to open a bank account (see p.35).

WELCOME DAYS

In order to provide you with complete information the International Office, the Communication Office with the participation of ESN-ULiège (Erasmus Student Network) organise some welcome days for exchange students. We recommend you to participate.

These days will occur:

- for stays during the 1st term and the whole year, **Thursday 8th and Friday 9th September 2022**
- for stays during the 2nd term, **Friday 3rd February 2023**

In September, an intercultural seminar is also organized.

A detailed programme will be sent individually by email.

AT THE END OF YOUR STAY

Before getting back home, you should inform your departmental coordinator about your departure. In addition, you have to come to the Erasmus Office to get your Attendance Certificate (Departure Form).

At the end of your stay, you also must notify the local administration.

For students on the Liège campus:

- either go to the appropriate desk with your national ID, the «annexe 8» or your «E card» (EU students) or «A card» (if you are from a country outside the EU) your address at your home country and 8€
- or connect on the e-platform of the City Hall of Liège <https://connexion-e-guichet.liege.be> in order to notify your departure (called «radiation»)

Students on the Gembloux or Arlon campuses must report to the respective local administration of their host city.

1 FRENCH COURSES

LANGUAGE REQUIREMENTS

At the University of Liège courses are in most cases taught in French. Exchange students therefore need to have sufficient proficiency of the language, both written and oral, to understand courses and to take part effectively in seminars and practicals.

Therefore we ask students **who follow courses given in French** to join to their application form a document testifying their level of French. The minimal required level is B1 (B2 for HEC Liège) according to the Common European Framework of Reference.

Next to this proof of language, at their arrival, **non French-speaking students who take courses in French** have to take a compulsory online test in French to attest their proficiency. The results are sent to departmental coordinators.

Dates for the online French tests:

- for the 1st term: **from 14th to 16th September 2022**
- for the 2nd term: **from 30th to 31st January 2023**

For courses taught in English a B1 certificate is required (B2 for HEC Liège).

IN LIÈGE

In Liège, French preparatory courses (before the beginning of the 1st term) and French courses (during the academic year) are organised by the “Département de français de l’Institut supérieur des Langues Vivantes (ISLV)”.

PREPARATORY COURSE

1st term preparatory course: **from 29th August to 7th september 2022** (no ECTS) 100€ charge for exchange students

COURSES DURING THE YEAR

For students who would like to follow a French course during their exchange in Liège, the compulsory test will be used to evaluate their level in order to create the groups for the courses.

- S1 = 1st term evening classes: **from 28th September 2022 to 13th January 2023**
- S2 = 2nd term evening classes: **from 8th February to 26th May 2023**

60 hours of class : 2x2hours per week and online module.

- S1 or S2 = 5 ECTS
- S1 + S2 = 10 ECTS if satisfactory result for the final evaluation of S1.

Levels: from A1 to B2+. C1 level is only organised in the second term. The C2 is not on offer.

Fees

- Free for ULiège exchange students who have the French language course on their Learning Agreement.
- 100€/term for exchange students who do not have the French language course on their Learning Agreement, regular students, doctoral and postdoctoral students, and trainees.

FULLY ONLINE COURSES

100% online course with experienced French teachers, available to all. Elementary (A1-A2) and intermediate (B1-B2) levels.

- 1st term: **from 3rd October to 16th December 2022**
- 2nd term: **from 6th March to 26th May 2023**

30 course hours: 2 hours per week via Zoom + Declic module (no ECTS)

Individual health insurance is **compulsory** in Belgium. Therefore, if they are not registered with a health care insurance in their home countries and valid in Belgium, students have to subscribe to the health insurance of their choice.

- **If you are from an EEA country** (EU + Iceland, Liechtenstein and Norway) and if you are insured through your own national health service, before leaving your home country, you should ask for the **European health insurance card**. This covers you in case of illness abroad. The period of validity may differ from one country to another and is maximum two years.

However, if you need to see a doctor in Belgium, it will be more convenient to subscribe to a Belgian health insurance so as to get about 75% of the medical costs paid back to you. The balance could be paid by your health insurance in your home country.

- **If you are from a non-EEA country**, you **must** have social coverage to stay in Belgium, either through comprehensive insurance policy taken out in your country of origin, or in Belgium.

In addition, through their registration at ULiège, **all university students** get civil liability and physical insurance coverage for any accident related to their university activities, at home and abroad.

If you want to take a health insurance (mutuelle) in Belgium, you will have to do it after your arrival in Liège, it is not possible to do it before. You will receive the necessary information in your Welcome Pack.

myULiège is a must-have tool for ULiège students as it is their main access to online resources. 3 LIBRARIES AT ULIÈGE

Internationally recognized for its commitment and pioneering initiatives for Open Access, the University of Liège provide to its researchers and students, through its ULiège Library, a very rich documentation easily accessible.

Besides nowadays' publications, the paper collections also include rich heritage documents: 6,500 manuscripts, 565 incunabula (among which 236 are unique items in Belgium and some even in the world), several dozens of thousands from 16th to 19th century books.

Some of those remarkable pieces have been digitalized and are now freely accessible on line at **donum.uliege.be**

Every item from the ULiège library collections, paper or electronic, can be found through the unique research interface: **lib.uliege.be**

Need scientific documentation everywhere, at any hour of the day? With the VPN, you can identify yourself and access most of the digital collections (110,000 journals, near 250,000 ebooks, 180 databases, etc.).

Libraries also provide you with:

- Infrastructures: over 2,200 seats, late opening hours until 9 p.m. and on Saturdays for the 3 bigger sites, 18 rooms dedicated to collective work (to book online)

VISIT THE PROVINCE OF LIÈGE

With the great asset of a central position, the Province of Liège is close to lots of great places and can rely on easy access thanks to several means of transport: a fast-train station, an airport, and a motorway network.

All over the year, but particularly when the sun is shining, you can enjoy a variety of walks and hikes. Next to the extended network of ways that are exclusively dedicated to walkers and cyclists (RAVeL), you can explore over 5,000 km of signposted walks (see www.liegetourisme.be)!

Major events are regularly organised in the Province of Liège. In the field of sports competition we can pinpoint several cycling races such as the start of the Tour de France; motorraces at Spa-Francorchamps, such as the Grand Prix... Many cultural events are also staged, such as the International Festival of Crime Movie (Film Policier), and a number of music festivals.

PRIVATE ACCOMMODATION - KOT

In Liège a student's bedsit is called a "kot". It's an individual room, generally furnished and rented by the landlord. Usually there are several kots in the same building. Students share facilities such as toilets, bathroom and kitchen. A room can also belong to the landlord's house, and the student will then share some facilities. They can also choose fully independent lodgings (studios, flats, or even houses). The price for a furnished kot is around 340€/month, additional costs not included.

If you stay the whole year in Liège, you must look for a "kot". A private accommodation database is available on www.campus.uliege.be/kot

There are two types of prices: those that include only the rent and those that include all or a part of the additional costs.

To have more choice and take time to compare accommodation, **we advise you to arrive in Liège at least one or two weeks before the beginning of classes.** It is better to wait until you are here to make a choice.

Do not pay anything before seeing the accommodation or make sure it is not a fraud.

Be very cautious and read carefully the renting contract your prospective landlord will have you sign, particularly regarding duration. In case you wish to sublet your accommodation, make sure this is possible in your renting agreement. A lawyer from "Centre J" can provide free help and advice. (see p.31)

Any student registered at the ULiège and with a Belgian Health Mutual Insurance (“mutualité”) is entitled to a ULiège rate with specialists (except dentists and plastic surgery) and emergency at “Centre Hospitalier Universitaire” of Sart Tilman.

You have to show your ULiège student card when you register at the main desk of the hospital then, the fee you will have paid will be repaid by your insurance (mutuelle) in Belgium. This does not apply to such medical acts as blood samples, scan tests, etc.

COMPUTER ROOMS

Nearly 100 computers are accessible according to a very large schedule. They are equipped with all the business software needed for the students' work.

This equipment, Internet access and the main scientific software enable the processing of research results or the preparation of experience and internship reports.

A student website offers distance learning, online information and support, supplementary exercises, preparation of questions, self-assessments, advice on working methods, etc. You also have the possibility to contact the assistants by email. More than 200 Wi-Fi terminals spread over the campus also offer Internet access.

TO SUM UP

BEFORE ARRIVING

Students applying for the 1st term or for the whole academic year have to fill the online application **between March 1st and May 31st**.

Students applying for the second term have to fill in **between October 1st and November 15th**.

Be careful: it will not be possible to complete the online Application Form after the deadlines.

- Discuss the courses you intend to take in Liège with your coordinator in your home university
- If you need a visa to enter Belgium, take the necessary steps with the Belgian embassy in your country of residence
- If you need a room in the university residence (one term stays maximum), send a form to the Accommodation Office
- If you wish to meet a local student who will guide you along, register to the buddy program
- Ask your european health insurance card (for EU students)
