Did you know about the Bienvenue en France level? This is a distinction that guarantees international students a high standard of quality in the welcome schemes and initiatives in those institutions certified. We are part of this level! And our team will be happy to welcome you.



If you are an exchange student or pursuing a double degree, you're likely familiar with the International Affairs team! They have been by your side throughout the nomination process, providing essential information regarding your Learning Agreement, arrival certificate, and offering assistance in your cultural integration journey.



If you have been recruited as an international student, we are confident that you are acquainted with the International Recruitment team! They have been instrumental in assisting you with the seamless integration into some of our permanent programs.



Across all our campuses, the Hub team is at your service. They are here to guide you through administrative procedures such as enrollment and can provide information on various matters, including visa applications and accommodation advice. You can request several documents through this service, such as your student ID, transcript of records, and school certificate.

OUR ACADEMIC YEAR

The academic year is divided into two semesters: fall semester (September to December) and spring semester (January to June). You can find the dates of your programme in your acceptance letter.

The European Credit Transfert System ECTS

The validation of one semester is equivalent to 30 ECTS credits, a year to $60\,\text{ECTS}$

Grading system & Exams

Grades in France are on a 20-point scale: 0 being the lowest grade and 20 the highest. The passing grade is 10/20.

Types of Exams

There are 3 types:

Continuous assessment:

allows for the validation of acquired knowledge throughout the year with regular evaluations in each subject.

Final exams: (or partial exams) take place at the end of each semester.

Remedial exams:

if you obtain a grade below 10/20 or are absent from a partial exam, you have a second chance to validate the concerned subject. Remediation is both a right and an obligation (except for students who have signed a "Learning Agreement").

Validation Conditions

To validate an academic semester:

- You must achieve a general average equal to or greater than **10/20**.
- Each subject must be validated with a score of 10/20. Generally, the calculation per subject is done as follows: 40% continuous assessment / 60% final exam.

Conversely, you will not validate your academic semester if:

- Your overall average is less than 10/20.
- You are absent from a remedial exam (no second chance for remediation is possible).

At the end of each semester, a committee either approves the success of the semester or lists the subjects that need remediation. Students are then informed accordingly. A school board meets after the remedial exams to confirm semester validations or not.

Attendance

The rule is simple: classes are mandatory.

A percentage of absences per subject is tolerated under certain conditions (refer to the academic regulations of your program).

Please note:

- Be careful not to miss a continuous assessment; it could result in a score of 0/20 in case of absence.
- Excessive absenteeism can significantly impact your academic success.

This may lead to:

- A prohibition from taking final exams (you will directly move to makeup exams, and the result will replace all grades obtained in the subject).
- Referral to a Disciplinary Board.


For students in apprenticeship programs: you must attend all classes as they are paid for by your employer (refer to the Learning Booklet).

Academic Integrity

No tolerance for acts of academic fraud, including plagiarism or cheating, will be accepted. EM Normandie considers such acts contrary to fairness and ethics, of which it is the guardian.

To combat fraud and promote academic integrity, the School is committed to three aspects:

- Information and prevention;
- Control and detection;
- Heavy sanctions, after referral to the Disciplinary Board, including possible expulsion.



Diploma Attainment

The diploma (Bachelor, Master's degree from the Grande Ecole Program, Master of Sciences/Specialized Master) is awarded to students who have validated:

- All required ECTS credits,
- Mandatory internships,
- The thesis or final study project with a score of 10/20.

Attention! For the Grande Ecole Program Master's degree, an additional requirement is:

- An English test chosen by the school: for students graduating in 2025-2026 and beyond, the required official TOEIC score (or equivalent) is 785.
- Regardless of the graduation conditions specified in the academic regulations, you must, to obtain your diploma, be in compliance administratively, including settling all tuition fees.

Diploma juries are scheduled in December and July each year. Students who do not meet the diploma requirements are granted a one-year period, renewable once, for a maximum of 2 years after the end of classes to fulfill these conditions.

The diploma ceremony generally takes place in March of the year following the diploma attainment.

Holidays and Bank holidays

During your stay with us, you might have holidays in October, December, February or April. Usually, students have one or two weeks off. We will confirm dates to you when sending the academic calendar of your programme.

Onboarding

Every semester, our school arranges orientation sessions for both local and international students. During your initial days with us, you will be invited to participate in various activities aimed at fostering connections among students. Additionally, we will guide you through administrative procedures to ensure a smooth transition.



Confirm my registration at EM Normandie

You have received your acceptance letter; it is now appropriate to confirm your enrollment at EM Normandie during a period that will be specified to you later.

Two important tools to remember:




The WARD application accessible on your mobile and your computer supports you throughout your academic, international, professional and associative journey.

You will find there your schedule, your grades, your courses, events, school news.



UpWard (accessible via WARD) allows you to access different educational content:

- Syllabus (program content)
- Course materials, homework, work to be completed,
- Evaluations,
- Career Path (support platform towards professionalization)
- Privileged space to communicate with your teachers





Add and drop period

During the initial two weeks of the academic program, the add and drop process is exclusively available for exchange and double degree students. Within this timeframe, students have the flexibility to make changes to their courses. They can add or drop courses by submitting modifications on the second page of their learning agreement.



Process:



Review the course offer to identify the course you would like to add







Implement the changes on the platform we provided and upload the new LA.



Await comments/validation from your international affairs coordinator



- It is not possible to mix courses from different programmes.
- You may take less than 30 credits (ECTS) if you wish to, the minimum to validate the semester for exchange students is 15 credits.
- We sugest you to confirm the number of credits that you are taking with your home university.
- In the course offer you will be able to find your programme and the courses that it is offering, note that some programmes have electives, and read carefully the availability of the number of electives.
- After the two weeks any change is available

It's important to emphasize that the learning agreement you submitted prior to your arrival serves as a reference only. Please be aware that the courses offered may undergo changes.


Student Clubs
