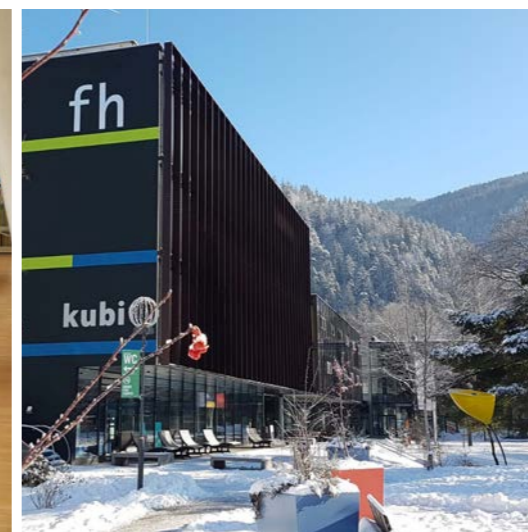

>> COUNTRY FACTS

Total area: approx. 84,000 km²

Population: 8.9 million

Capital: Vienna

Languages: German; English is by far the leading foreign language and is widely spoken and understood.

Topography: The landscapes in Austria range from Alpine peaks to broad river plains. Austria's highest mountain is the Großglockner (3,797 m); its longest river is the Danube.

Austria, a captivating destination located in the heart of Europe, beckons visitors with its timeless charm and diverse offerings. From the majestic, historic yet modern city of Vienna to the many crystal-clear lakes, picturesque castles, Alpine adventure possibilities and melodious culture of classical music, there is bound to be something for everyone to enjoy.

>> CITY FACTS

Total area: approx. 39.37 km²

Population: approx. 20,000. Kufstein is the largest town in the District of Kufstein and the second largest after Innsbruck in the Province of Tyrol.

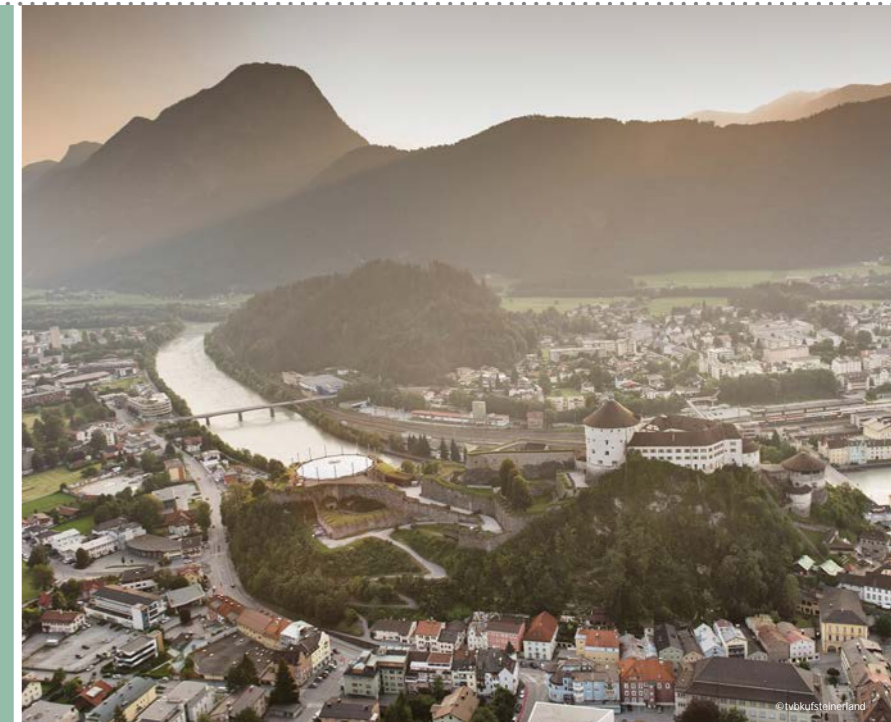
Climate: Kufstein lies 503 meters above sea level. The alpine climate is characterized by cold, snowy winters and relatively warm summers. Temperatures range from -5° C in winter (short periods of strong frost are possible too) up to 30° C in summer. Periods of fog and rain are common both in late fall and early spring.

Be prepared for all weather conditions and bring warm clothes and boots!



Set on both sides of the river Inn, Kufstein is located in the lower Inn River Valley and only a few kilometers from the Alpine foothills in Bavaria. The contrast between the historic old town, the fortress and the nearby mountains strongly contribute to the atmosphere and attraction of Kufstein. Thus the city's nickname: "The Pearl of Tyrol."

Kufstein is surrounded by high mountains with a breath-taking panorama. Kufstein's local mountain Pendling has a phenomenal 360-degree view over the Inn Valley, the Kaisergebirge and the Alps. The Kaisergebirge provides a local hiking paradise with many traditional mountain huts to enjoy a drink, a meal, and a picturesque view.



"THE PEARL OF TYROL" A BRIEF HISTORY OF THE CITY OF KUFSTEIN

There are still countless old buildings which bear witness to the medieval times when Kufstein was first given the rights of township. Lovingly restored, they invite the visitors to imagine what it must have been like 700 years ago.

The mighty fortress in the center shows how important the position of Kufstein was at that time. Originally owned by the bishops of Regensburg, the fortress was first mentioned in official documents in 1205. From 1313 onwards, the Kufstein Fortress belonged to the dukes of Bavaria. In 1415 Duke Ludwig II enlarged the fortification. In 1504 Emperor Maximilian I besieged and conquered Kufstein and had the fortress rebuilt and expanded. In the 17th century, the complex was reconstructed once again. In 1703 and 1805, the Bavarians conquered the fortress. Later, in 1814, it was recaptured by the Austrians and has belonged to the city of Kufstein since 1924.

Today, one of the most impressive parts of the fortress is the open air stage, which is frequently used as a concert and event venue. Within the fortress compound is also the world's largest open air organ, which fills the city with music at midday each day of the week.

Kufstein is not only interesting for visitors keen on history and culture; the town is also a well-known commercial center. There are quite a few companies that have helped to establish Kufstein's economic importance, for example: Riedel, a maker of creative glassware; Kneissl, the first ski manufacturer in Austria; and Simmerwerke, a producer of high-tech sealing rings.

ARRIVING IN KUFSTEIN

>> TRAVELING TO KUFSTEIN

Kufstein is conveniently situated at one of Europe's most important North-South axes and can therefore be easily reached by car, train and plane.

By car:

Take the motorway (Autobahn) exit "Kufstein Süd" or "Kufstein Nord" and follow the signs "Zentrum" (city center). Then follow the signs "Fachhochschule Kufstein". Public parking can be found in the vicinity.

By train:

Most trains on this route stop in Kufstein. The university is only a 10-minute walk from the station. See page 9 for further information on public transport.

By plane:

The closest airports are Munich in Germany (approx. 120 km), as well as Innsbruck (approx. 80 km) and Salzburg (approx. 100 km) in Austria.

>> VISA & IMMIGRATION PROCEDURE

If you are a national of the European Union (EU), European Economic Area (EEA) or Switzerland, you only need a valid passport to enter Austria. Residence requirements for students from the EU/EEA/Switzerland and Visa requirements for third-country students can be found [online](#). The International Relations Office offers support to students to obtain their visa or residence permits.

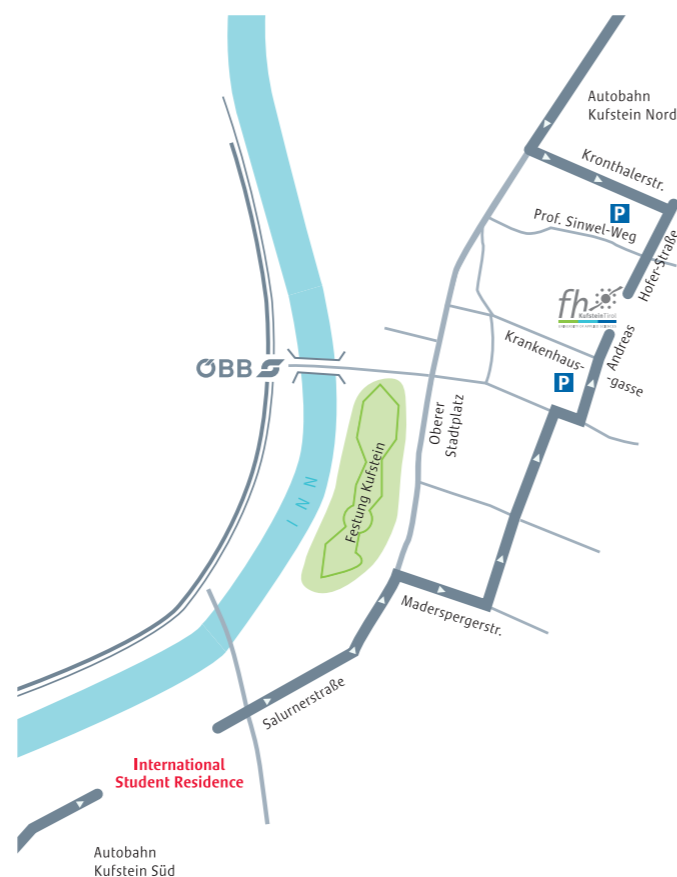

>> FINANCIAL SUPPORT

The FH Kufstein Tirol itself does not offer financial support to students, but there are **numerous possibilities** for obtaining aid such as governmental stipends, grants or sponsorships.



>> HEALTH INSURANCE

All exchange students must have medical insurance that covers the cost of treatment in Austria in case of an accident or illness. The insurance must be valid for the entire duration of stay in Austria. For stays lasting less than six months (with or without a visa), a travel health insurance is usually sufficient.

>> LEISURE ACTIVITIES

Sports

Kufstein is the ideal place for summer and winter sports. The Alps offer the best outdoor sporting activities, for example hiking and climbing in the summer and skiing, snowboarding or tobogganing in the winter. Kufstein also has countless sport clubs such as football (soccer), volleyball, tennis, basketball, and ice hockey. The ÖH (student union) of the university also offers its own sports program for students.

Cultural Activities

Kufstein organises cultural events throughout the entire year such as concerts on the fortress, music and wine festivals in the city center, and the annual christmas markets. As a university city, cafes, bars, and pubs are also a popular place to meet after studying.

Shopping

Kufstein residents can browse through a great selection of individual stores and larger shopping centers, especially within the pedestrian zone of the city center.

>> MEDICAL FACILITIES

Should you need medical attention, you can either see a general practitioner or go to the hospital. The hospital is at the southern end of Kufstein. Medication can only be bought at pharmacies. Pharmacies with nighttime and weekend standby services can be found online. Further information is available within the Student Starter Course on the student intranet platform FH.CheckIn.

>> PUBLIC TRANSPORTATION

Kufstein is a small city where almost everything is within walking distance. The university is in the city center and can be easily reached by bike, bus, car, and on foot.

The city bus connects all parts of Kufstein and nearby towns. Short term parking zones, underground parking as well as several bike-sharing stations are conveniently located throughout the city.

i TRAVEL DISCOUNTS

The Austrian Railway Services (ÖBB) offers a 50% discount card ("Vorteilscard Jugend") for anyone under the age of 26 years traveling within Austria. The Bayern-Ticket for Bavaria allows for 1-5 persons to travel within Bavaria, for example to Munich.

INTERNATIONAL PROGRAM

The FH Kufstein Tirol offers a special International Program (IP) for incoming students. A pre-selection of courses is made based on the course catalogue before arrival. The final enrolment takes place during the Orientation Days on site.

The language of instruction is English. Free German courses (beginner or intermediate) are available for incoming students. A placement test is done after arrival.

ECTS: EUROPEAN CREDIT TRANSFER SYSTEM

ECTS (European Credit Transfer and Accumulation System) is a scheme that encourages transparency in teaching and learning within higher education in Europe and thus facilitates the recognition of student performance across borders and among different universities. ECTS makes it possible for students to transfer their learning experiences between institutions, fosters greater student mobility, and gives students greater flexibility in earning a degree. Moreover, the system plays a role in curriculum development and in quality assurance.

>> KEY FEATURES

ECTS is based on the principle that 60 credits measure the workload of a fulltime student during one academic year. The student workload of a full-time study program in Europe usually amounts to around 1,500 - 1,800 hours per year and in those cases one credit stands for around 25 to 30 working hours.

Credits in ECTS can only be obtained after successful completion of the work required and appropriate assessment of the learning outcomes achieved.

Student workload in ECTS consists of the time required to complete all planned learning activities such as attending lectures, seminars, independent study, preparation of projects, and examinations.

The **performance** of the student is documented by the local/national grading system.

The **Learning Agreement** contains the list of courses to be taken with the ECTS credits which will be awarded for each course. This list must be agreed to by the student and the responsible academic body of the home institution. In the case of credit transfer, the Learning Agreement has to be agreed to by the student and the two institutions concerned before the student's departure and updated immediately when changes occur.

The **Transcript of Records** documents the performance of a student by showing the list of courses taken, the ECTS credits gained, local or national credits, if any, local grades and possibly ECTS grades awarded. In the case of credit transfer, the Transcript of Records has to be issued by the home institution for outgoing students before departure and by the host institution for incoming students at the end of their period of study.

>> DIPLOMA SUPPLEMENT (DS)

The Diploma Supplement is a document attached to a higher education diploma providing a standardized description of the nature, level, context, content, and status of the studies that were successfully completed by the graduate. The Diploma Supplement provides transparency and facilitates academic and professional recognition of qualifications (diplomas, degrees, certificates).

>> Room Numbers

The room numbers are split into three sections defining the exact location on campus. For example:

This room is in building B, second floor, room number 16.

(Please note that the ground floor is "0")



CAFE.04 & DINER

The university's cafeteria is located on the ground floor in Building B and features a fantastic view of the Kufstein Fortress and into the city park. The CAFe.04 offers hot and cold beverages as well as snacks throughout the day. The Diner provides a lunch buffet with a selection of warm meals and a fresh salad bar. Vending machines for drinks and snacks outside of the cafeteria's opening hours are available.

COMPUTER FACILITIES

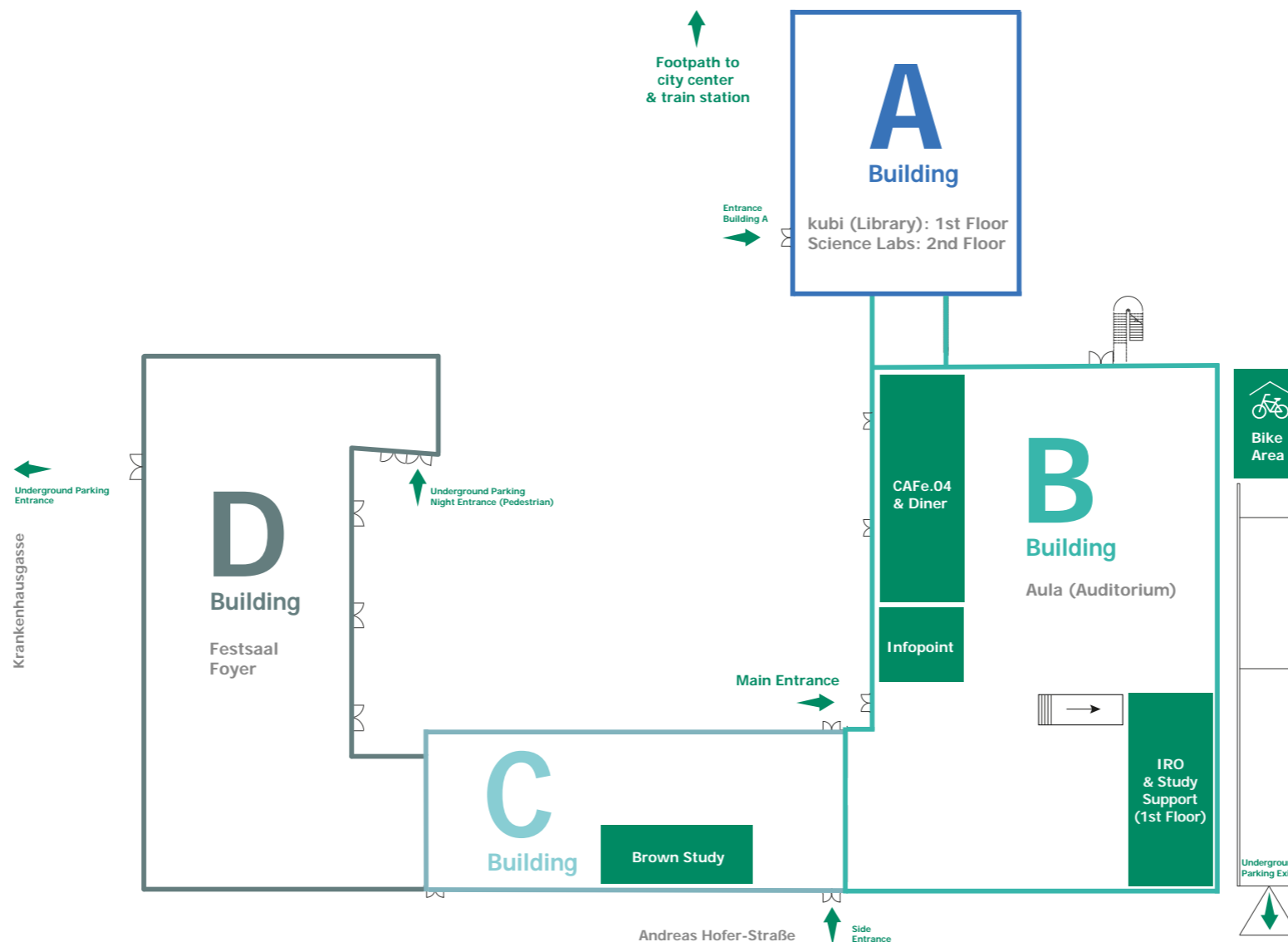
The computer room ("Brown Study") is located on the ground floor of Building C. Here you will find several PCs, computers with a CD writer and scanner, plugs for notebooks, a printer and one fully-equipped cutting desk. The printer is designed to be used with the student card, which has a prepaid function that is rechargeable and can be loaded at the terminal in the university. LIBRARY

The university library ("kubi") contains printed and digital books, journals and newspapers from various fields. An automated borrowing system as well as work spaces for independent research and group study are provided. The library also offers an equipment rental system for cameras, microphones, tablets, etc.

ÖH FH KUFSTEIN

The representation of students (ÖH) is regulated by law in Austria and represents the interests towards the responsible ministries. The mandatory fee is used in part for insurances, however 87% of the sum remains with the local ÖH and benefits the students through a variety of activities, projects and services. SCIENCE LABS

The university science labs provide a research infrastructure to address challenges in manufacturing, communication, mobility, finance and education. All students can use and rent the equipment for free (also for personal projects!) after a brief training.

INCLUSION

The university offers barrier-free access to learning facilities. Students can apply for an extended examination time if needed (with a medical report from a specialist). For assistance and additional information, please contact the IRO team.
