Student Support Services

- **Pre-Arrival Sessions & Coffee Chats:** MBS offers a Pre-Arrival Session in May/November to guide students through the next steps after official admission. Following this, Coffee Chats with the International Center are held in June/July and November/December, providing an opportunity to address any remaining questions.
- **Orientation Day:** This event helps students getting settled in Munich as well as at MBS. It covers important topics such as registration, health insurance, transportation, visa issues etc.
- **Housing:** While MBS does not have on-campus housing, it provides students with information on where to obtain off-campus housing. Accepted students will be added to our MBS Homeseekers community on Microsoft Teams where students can exchange housing offers amongst each other and the latest info on housing options is shown.
- **Visa:** MBS issues non-EU nationals visa letters required to obtain a student visa (Visum für Studienzwecke) at the German embassy in their country.
- **Statutory Health Insurance:** MBS works very closely with Techniker Krankenkasse (TK). Our advisor at TK will help you with all your questions and be present during the Orientation Day where you have the possibility to purchase the statutory German Health Insurance.
- **Mental Health First Aid (MHFA):** MBS provides immediate support and guidance for students facing mental health challenges.

WHY MUNICH?

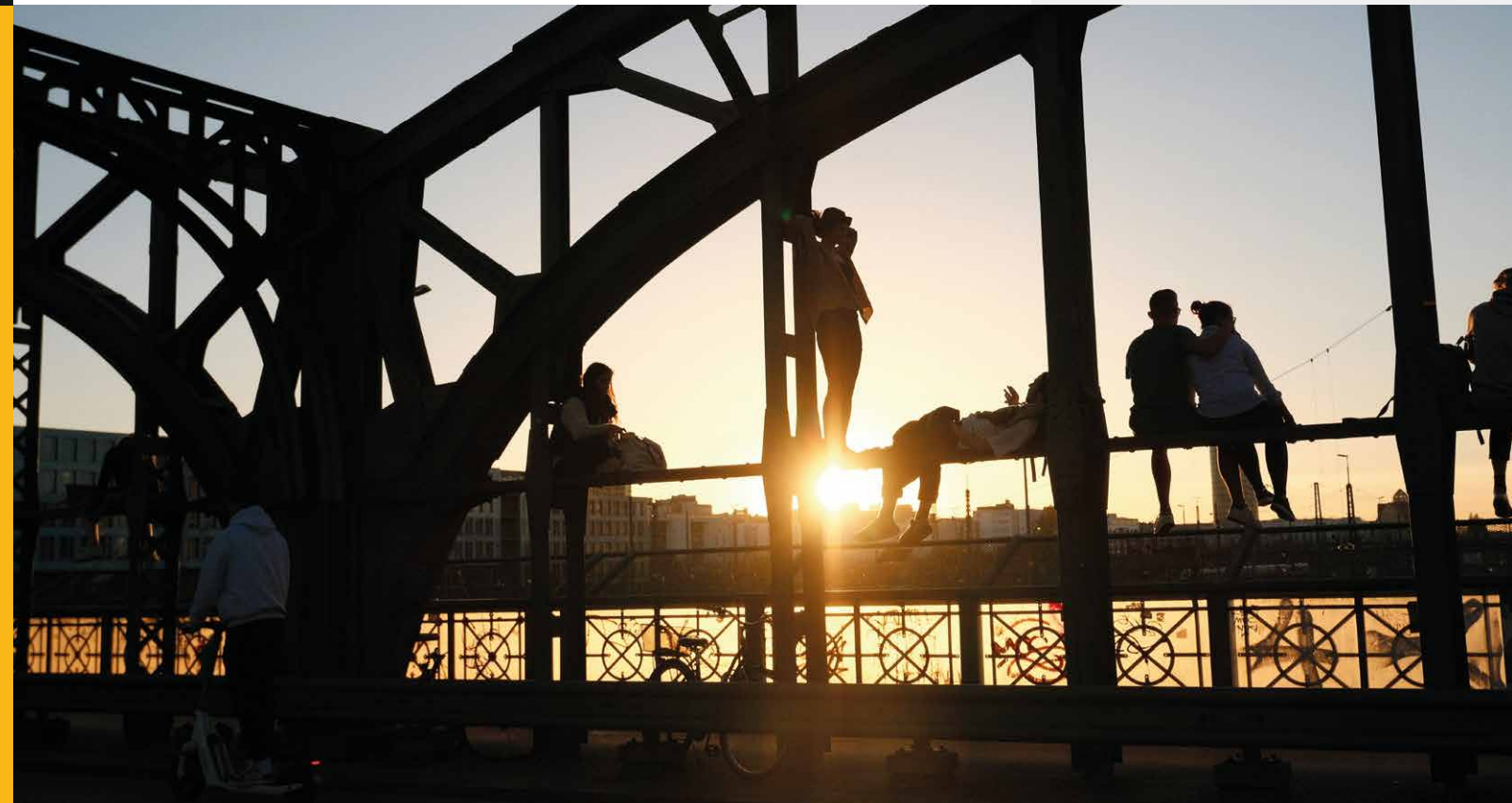

Exchange students pay tuition to their home university. The 2024 tuition for freemovers in the academic year 2024/2025 is:

- undergraduate level: EUR 5,970/semester
- graduate level: EUR 8,300/semester

The tuition for the academic year 2025/2026 is:

- undergraduate level: EUR 6,180/semester
- graduate level: EUR 8,580 EUR/semester

Cost of Living

Estimated living costs would be around EUR 1,450 per month (including health insurance), depending on student's lifestyle and social activities. Non-EU students must purchase a German health insurance.

"The three months I spent at MBS as an exchange student went by in no time. Twelve weeks of learning, friendship, and connecting with lecturers. After applying for MBS, I was in contact with the MBS International Center. Prior to my arrival, they clearly explained where and how to find an apartment, how to deal with German health insurance or even how public transport works. The MBS administration department reacted very quickly, was available on a regular basis to answer our questions and/or to work on finding a solution together and they were super-friendly.

On my first day, I was welcomed in a very friendly way. Everyone did their best to create links between the incoming exchange students and the students from regular programs.

It was also a pleasure working with the lecturers at MBS, especially because they were always interested in the student's points of view on topics as well. They were experts in their field and their teaching style was excellent and always referred to real problems. As we studied in small groups the professors could easily adjust their instructions to our individual needs. MBS also gives its students the opportunity to listen to guest lecturers from the industry who present current topics such as 'What is globalization?' or 'What is e-commerce?' from Unilever.

I also really enjoyed the various extracurricular activities offered during the semester, such as a visit to Neuschwanstein Castle, a concentration camp in Dachau or the city of Nuremberg to discover German history and culture.

Concluding, my experience was great and it gave me a wonderful opportunity for my near future. I wish you the same opportunities to discover what Munich Business School is all about."
