

We are available for anything you may need to ensure you have great stay. We hope you enjoy your time here at ULiège.



#### THE TRADITIONAL UNIVERSITY CAREER


In Belgium, university studies are in line with the European model. They are organised into three cycles: bachelor's, master's and doctorate. The average academic studies are carried out in 2 cycles, generally in 5 years (bachelor + master).

#### **EXAMINATIONS**

Within the same academic year students can take two examinations on the same teaching unit (course).

Exams are organised by the Faculties during three periods decided by the Board of Directors (see the academic calendar). The 1<sup>st</sup> and 2<sup>nd</sup> periods are called "the 1<sup>st</sup> session" (January and June). The 3<sup>rd</sup> period is called the 2<sup>nd</sup> session (August-September).



By way of derogation, Faculties can decide on special examination modalities for exchange students. In this case the exchange student must get in touch with the involved professors and the departmental coordinator at the beginning of term.

The result of each assessment is indicated by a figure between 0 and 20, with 10 out of 20 being the pass threshold for each teaching unit.

Marks received at ULiège are transferred to your home university by your ULiège departmental coordinator. The grade distribution table is sent with your transcript of records. You will find the general table for ULiège on our webpage.

We wish to remind you that, although your results will be validated in your home university, while in Liège, you are subject to the university's regulations governing study and examination. Your departmental coordinator can answer specific questions relating to examinations. We strongly encourage that you read the information about plagiarism that should be quite useful when you write papers.

#### 4. ACADEMIC CALENDAR

The university year is divided into three terms, with the exception of certain assessments, work placements, projects or professional integration activities. Teaching and learning activities occur during (one of) the first two terms. They are followed by assessment periods.

The third term includes assessment periods, personal research and production of essays, as well as professional insertion activities.

#### 1. THE ECTS SYSTEM

The University of Liège uses ECTS system (European Credit Transfer and Accumulation System), which facilitates the recognition of your academic credits during your stay. Usually, a term is equivalent to 30 ECTS and a full year to 60 ECTS, but this may differ according to your home institution.

On Registration Day, please bring with you a copy of your acceptance letter (scan or pdf is enough) and your valid ID document (ID card or passport).

Any change that may occur during your stay (change of address, telephone number, etc.) must be entered via the myULiège portal (My profile).

Check your uliege email inbox regularly as it is the official means of communication by the university to share important and useful information with students.

#### Students residing in a border country (annex 33)

For students who are citizens or have a residence permit from France, Germany, Luxembourg and the Netherlands, the following documents are required:

- o valid identity document (passport or identity card) or residence permit
- o certificate of registration from the International Office at ULiège
- o lease or landlord's certificate
- o 1 recent passport-size photo
- o 11€\*

<sup>\*</sup> see rates in force on the registration date

#### **European students (EU)**

For students from EEE countries (EU + Iceland, Liechtenstein and Norway), the following documents are required:

- valid passport or identity card
- o certificate of registration from the International Office at ULiège
- proof of health insurance cover (European card or private insurance)
- o address in Liège (if in a students' residence, a residence statement)
- 1 recent passport-size photo
- o 22€ + 25.20€ for the residence card\*

EU students can move from one EU country to another with a national ID or passport; no visa is required.

### European student - as part of a mobility/exchange programme (study in Belgium for min 3 months and max 6 months)

For students from EEE countries (EU + Iceland, Liechtenstein and Norway), the following documents are required:

- valid passport or identity card
- o certificate of registration from the International Office at ULiège
- 1 recent passport-size photo
- o 11€

#### Students from a country outside the EU

Non-EU students must report their arrival at the city hall on arrival (after registration at ULiège) to get a residence permit.

For students from a country outside the EU, the following documents are required:

- o passport with a D visa
- o certificate of registration from the International Office at ULiège
- o proof of means of support
- o address in Liège (if in a students' residence, a residence statement)
- O 1 passport-size photo
- o 22€ + 23,60€\*

Students from outside the EU who stay in Belgium and wish to travel outside the country should have a valid visa and annex 15 issued by the municipal authorities.

To travel outside the Schengen area, consult the diplomatic mission of the country you wish to visit, as to whether a visa is required.

Non-european students may be required to open a Belgian bank account (see p.50).



#### 4. WELCOME DAYS

#### AT THE END OF YOUR STAY

Before going back home, you must inform your departmental coordinator about your departure. In addition, you must come to the International Office to receive your Attendance Certificate (Departure Form) at the office or by email.

At the end of your stay, you also must notify the local administration if and only if you hold a Belgian residence permit.

#### For students on the Liège campus:

- either go to the local municipal office with your national ID, the «annexe 8» or your «E card» (EU students) or «A card» (if you are from a country outside the EU) a new address in your home country and 11€
- or connect on the e-platform of the City Hall of Liège in order to notify your departure (called «radiation»):

# LANGUAGE TRAINING

#### 1. FRENCH COURSES

#### LANGUAGE REQUIREMENTS

At the University of Liège most courses are taught in French. Exchange students therefore need to have sufficient language proficiency, both written and oral, to understand courses and to effectively take part in seminars and tutorials.

Students **who plan to take a course in French**, must include proof of language proficiency to their university application. The minimal required level is B1 (B2 for HEC Liège) according to the Common European Framework of Reference.

Upon arrival and in addition to a language proficiency certificate, **non French-speaking students who take courses in French** have to take a compulsory online test in French to attest their proficiency. The results are sent to departmental coordinators.

Dates for the online French tests:

- for the 1st term: from 6th to 18th September 2025
- for the 2nd term: 9th and 10th February 2026

For courses taught in English a B1 certificate is required (B2 for HEC Liège).



#### **9** IN LIÈGE

In Liège, French preparatory courses (before the beginning of the 1st term) and French courses (during the academic year) are organised by the "Département de français de l'Institut supérieur des Langues Vivantes (ISLV)".

#### 1 | Preparatory course

 $1^{st}$  term preparatory course: **from 1^{st} to 10^{th} September 2025** (no ECTS)  $120 \in$  fee for exchange students.

#### 2 | Courses during the year

For students who would like to follow a French course during their exchange in Liège, the compulsory test will be used to evaluate their level in order to create the groups for the courses.

- S1 = 1st term evening classes: from 29th September 2025 to 16th January 2026
- S2 = 2<sup>nd</sup> term evening classes: from 18<sup>th</sup> February to 29<sup>th</sup> May 2026

60 hours of class: 2 x 2 hours per week and online module.

- S1 or S2 = 5 ECTS
- S1 + S2 = 10 ECTS if satisfactory result for the final evaluation of S1.
- ▲ Levels: from A1 to B2+. C1 level is only organised in the second term. C2 is not on offer.

#### Fees

- Free for ULiège exchange students who have the French language course in their Learning Agreement.
- 120€/term for other students.

#### 3 | Fully online courses

100% online course with experienced French teachers, are available for the following levels: Elementary (A1-A2) and intermediate (B1-B2) levels.

- 1st term: from 6th October to 19th December 2025
- 2<sup>nd</sup> term: from 9<sup>th</sup> March to 29<sup>th</sup> May 2026

30 course hours: 2 hours per week via Zoom + Declic module (**no ECTS**)

Fee: 60€ per term

#### **ONLY** IN GEMBLOUX

A French course for non-native speakers is organised during the year in Namur (10 minutes by train from Gembloux train station) and credited with 3 ECTS. At the first meeting the respective level of each student is assessed so that groups can be organised.

## HEALTH INSURANCE AND HEALTH CARE

Individual health insurance is **compulsory** in Belgium. If you are not registered with a health care insurance provider in your home country which covers your stay in Belgium, you must subscribe to a **health insurance** provider in Belgium.

• If you are from an EEA country (EU + Iceland, Liechtenstein and Norway) and if you are insured through your own national health service, before leaving your home country, you should ask for the **European health insurance card**. This covers you in case of illness abroad. The period of validity may differ from one country to another and is a maximum of two years.

However, if you need to see a doctor in Belgium, it will be more convenient to register with a Belgian health insurance provider so as to get about 75% of the medical costs paid back to you. The balance could be paid by your health insurance in your home country.

 If you are from a non-EEA country, you must have coverage to stay in Belgium, either through comprehensive insurance policy taken out in your country of origin, or in Belgium.

In addition, through their registration at ULiège, **all university students** get civil liability and physical insurance coverage for any accident related to their university activities, at home and abroad.

If you want to subscribe to a health insurance (mutuelle) in Belgium, you will have to do it after your arrival in Liège, it is not possible to do it before. You will receive the necessary information in your Welcome Pack.

**Standard Multi (Rail Pass):** Similar to Youth Multi (Go Pass 10), but without age limit and for  $105 \in (102 \in \text{with the App})$ .

### 1. LIÈGE

### THE CITY OF LIÈGE

Liege is the largest city in the French-speaking part of Belgium. Located in the eastern region of the country, it sits on the Meuse river. This folkloric, historic and multifaced city invites you to discover one of its many neighbourhoods which are more like small villages. On Sunday morning, stroll through "La Batte", the longest running, open-air market in Europe, set up along the riverbanks.

### **VISIT THE PROVINCE OF LIÈGE**

At the crossroads between The Netherlands, Germany and Flanders (the Dutch-speaking part of Belgium), the Province of Liege is easily accessible by all modes of transportation, including a high-speed rail station and an airport.

Throughout the year, but particularly when the sun is shining, you can enjoy a variety of walks and hikes. In addition to a large network of paths and trails, exclusively dedicated to walkers and cyclists (RAVeL), you can explore over 5,000 km of signposted walks (see https://ravel.wallonie.be/home.html)!

Many cultural events are also hosted each year, such as the International Festival of Crime Movie (Film Policier), and a number of music festivals. Popular gatherings include, Retrouvailles (with over 300 associations in all fields from sports to politics and from drama to healthcare presenting their activities), the "Fêtes de Wallonie", and the funfair in October ("Foire d'octobre"). Night life is in itself an attraction, with dozens and dozens of cafés and restaurants, cinemas, concerts and performances that make Liège a very lively city.

### PRIVATE ACCOMMODATION

In Liège, a student's bedsit is called a "kot". It's an individual room, generally furnished and rented out by the landlord. Usually there are several kots in the same building. Students share facilities such as toilets, bathroom and kitchen. A room can also be located in a landlord's house, with shared facilities. Students can also choose fully independent lodgings (studios, flats, or even houses). The price for a furnished kot is around 400€/month, additional costs not included.

It is important to note that the price can be presented in two different ways: either it only includes the rent, or it includes rent and all or part of the utility charges. To ensure a good quality of accommodation and that you have time to compare prices, it is preferable to arrive in Liege one or two weeks before the start of the academic year. It's better to wait until you have arrived before making your choice. Please note! It's advisable not to pay for accommodation before you've seen it in person, to be sure you're not dealing with a scam. Be very careful, and read the rental agreement carefully, especially for duration of the rent. If you are planning to rent out your property on a sublet basis, make sure your lease allows for this. A jurist from "Consulex "can help and advise you for free. Contact the International Office for more information.

Any student registered at the ULiège and with a Belgian Health Mutual Insurance ("mutualité") is entitled to a ULiège rate with specialists (except dentists and plastic surgery) and emergency at "Centre Hospitalier Universitaire" of Sart Tilman.

You have to show your ULiège student card when you register at the main desk of the hospital then, the fee you will have paid will be repaid by your insurance (mutuelle) in Belgium. This does not apply to such medical acts as blood samples, scan tests, etc.

Make sure you mention your ULiège ID ("matricule ULiège") when you make the appointment.
