

# Residence Permit Guide for Exchange Students

# What is the residence permit?



The **residence permit** is an official document given by a country's government to a foreign person. This document will allow you to stay legally in Italy for a specific period.

Are you a non-EU student staying in Italy for more than 90 days?

Apply for a Residence Permit within 8 days of arrival.

It is mandatory for you to have it.



# Step 1: Prepare Documents and schedule an appointment at the Erasmus office for assistance

#### What documents do you need for this appointment?

- Copy of your Italian Tax Code (Codice Fiscale Don't have a Tax Code? Follow the instructions at https://en.unibg.it/global/students-exchange/erasmusincoming-students/on-your-arrival)
- Copy of your Passport (personal data + Visa + all stamped pages)
- > Certificate of Enrollment at the University (you will receive it at the Erasmus office)
- Health Insurance Policy valid in Italy
- Declaration of Hospitality (ask your landlord or the accommodation office accommodation.service@unibg.it to give you a copy of the Declaration of Hospitality)
- > Duty Stamp (Marca da Bollo) €16 (You can buy it at the Tabacconist)



### Step 2: Residence Permit Kit

### **★** Where do you need to go?

#### **Patronato UIL office**

#### ■ What documents do you need for this appointment?

You will need to bring all documents checked with the International Office (step 1)

### What do you need to do at the post office?

At Patronato you need to submit all the documents checked with the International Office (step 1) and at the end, you will receive a Yellow Kit.



### Step 3: Submit the Yellow Kit at the Post Office

### ★ Where do you need to go?

Go to an authorized Post Office in Bergamo:

VIA MALJ TABAJANI, 1 (Monday to Friday 8:20 a.m. – 1:35 p.m. / Saturday 8:20 a.m. – 12.35 p.m.)

VIA BRIGATA BERGAMO, 2 (Monday to Friday 8:20 a.m. – 1:35 p.m. / Saturday 8:20 a.m. – 12:35 p.m.)

#### What documents do you need for this appointment?

- Your passport
- > The yellow kit you get from the Patronato Office
- Steps at the post office:
- Pay fees (€30.46 + €40.00)
- Submit the Yellow Kit with Duty Stamp
- Fill out a registered letter form (€30 fee)
- Receive an appointment at the Immigration Office (Questura)

#### What do you need to do after your post office appointment?

- Keep the application receipt they will give you and make a copy of it to always carry with you
- Send a copy of the receipt via email to <u>incoming@unibg.it</u>



# Step 4: Appointment at Questura

Attend the assigned appointment for fingerprint and photographic registration.

### ★ Where do you need to go?

Immigration office - Questura di Bergamo

#### What documents do you need for this appointment?

- > Passport
- 4 passport-size photos (white background)
- Application receipt from Post Office
- Copies of Original documents submitted in the Yellow Kit
- > The letter issued by Post Office (confirmation of your appointment at Questura)

### Step 5: Collect Your Residence Permit Card

- Processing takes about 40 days.
- You will receive an SMS notification when your card is ready to pick up at Questura.
- Bring your passport and application receipt to collect it.
- Make a copy of your permit and store it safely.

#### **Important Notes**

- Traveling While Applying:
- Type D visa holders can visit Schengen countries for up to 90 days.
- Always carry your passport and receipt of the application.
- For temporary return home, take a direct flight or stop outside Schengen.
- ! Lost Residence Permit:
- Report it at Questura.
- Request a duplicate at the Post Office with Form 209.
- Pay €16 for a new Duty Stamp and €30 processing fee.
